

#### JULY

- Invoices available from the Treasurer's Office
- Departments start sending scholarship notices to the Financial Aid office
- Parent Plus Loan application becomes available

#### SEPTEMBER

- September 3

   Census date
- <u>September 4</u>
   Enrollment set

- 3rd party payments, employee dependent waivers, and VA benefits begin to be applied

#### JUNE

- Financial Aid Notices
   mailed to your home
   address
- Aid begins to be put on your UAConnect Financial Aid tile

#### AUGUST

- State rosters arrive for posting on UAConnect
   Outside scholarships start arriving - visible on UAC once cleared by Treasurer
- Parent Plus and private loans begin to be put on UAC
- <u>August 13</u>
   Aid can begin releasing to pay the bill
- August 19
   First Day of Class

Accept Federal Stafford loans in UAConnect, if needed



Have parents apply for Parent PLUS (studentaid.gov) or private alternative student loans as needed



Be sure to enroll in the required number of hours for grants, scholarships, and loans



# Adjusting Expectations

	High School	College
Responsibility & Time Management	Reminders & support come from others (teachers/family/mentors)	Priorities and organizing tasks are managed by the student
Self-Directed Learning	The majority of coursework is done in class. Teachers guide the learning process	Expected to learn material BEFORE lectures, engage DURING class, and prepare AFTER class (2-3 hours of studying outside class per credit hour)
Make-Up Credit	Bonus/extra credit opportunities available (?)	Bonus/extra credit opportunities are rare. Students expected to seek help/support
